10-year-old shuttler Riya battles pain to overcome opponents

MUMBAI: It is tough to find sportspersons who play with injuries in three categories simultaneously let alone in rounds that would not even earn one a medal. But for 10-year-old Riya Vinkerher, pain takes a backseat every time she wants to step on court.

Riya suffers from Osgood-Schlatter disease, one where inflammation happens right below the knee role where the kneecap's tendon attaches itself to the shinbone. Given that the chances of the inflammation increases with physical activity, she suffers the most when she is playing. But that is what keeps her going.

"Initially I thought it is a normal pain like it happens with kids who play so much. She had been complaining about it for the past two-three months. But it is only around 15 days back when it got diagnosed as the Osgood-Schlatter disease," her father

said, applying an ice-pack on her knee, something that has now sort of become a routine every time Riya completes a match.

On Tuesday as well, as Riya earned herself a spot in the semifinal of the under-11 category of PNB MetLife Junior Badminton Championship, her excitement could be sensed with every successful smash. She also participated in under-13 and under-15 categories.

Barring the tapes on her knee, nothing gave away that she was

playing through pain. "I started shouting on court after watching Carolina Marin do so. Initially, I used to do it consciously... sometimes to celebrate the point or to motivate myself. It has now turned into a habit and comes naturally. It boosts me," Riya said at the sidelines at the Andheri Sports Complex.

A student of the Jitesh Padukone Shuttlers' Academy in Sion, Riya had taken up badminton at the age of six. Reason? Illness, yet again. She said, "I wouldn't keep too well. Fever, cough and cold, etc. something or the other would always keep cropping up and I would fall sick too often. Someone suggested I should go out and play more to stay physically fit. Now, badminton is what I want to make a career out of."

Her stubbornness has helped her clinch gold in the girls' under-10 category at the state championships last year and emerge champion at the MSSA tournament.

NAGPUR: The giant-killing run of Vinil Mokhade was stopped in the final of the PNB MetLife Junior Badminton Championship which concluded at the Andheri Sports Complex in Mumbai on Thursday.

In an exciting U-17 boys singles summit clash, Nagpur's Vinil gave a big scare to top seed Siddharth Bhuta before going down fighting. Mumbai teenager Siddharth edged past unseeded Vinil 9-15, 15-5, 15-8 in 28 minutes.

Tall and lanly Vinil began with a bang and captured the first game quite easily. However, Siddharth, a trainee of Uday Pawar Badminton Academy, staged a strong recovery to claim the next two games.

Earlier in the semifinal, Vinil stunned second seed Atharva Joshi of Mumbai 11-15, 15-11, 15-12 in half an hour to reach the final. Vinil was the lone city player to reach the final as others crashed out on the penultimate day of the five-day competition on Wednesday.

Mumbai's Naishaa Kaur Bhatoye missed the double crown by a whisker.

The talented shuttler grabbed the U-13 girls singles beating Nirmitee Gajbhiye in three games. But later in the day, Nirmitee avenged the loss by claiming the U-15 girls singles crown by a wafer thin margin.

Naishaa also had to be satisfied with the runner-up spot in the U-17 girls singles. Unseeded Saanvi Mukadam downed second seed Naishaa in all-Mumbai battle.

The U-11 boys singles title was annexed by Dev Ruparelia, who ousted Soneesh S Singh 15-12, 10-15, 15-7 in a thriller.
